This week's Bible readings 2 Corinthians 5.6-10, (11-13),14-17 • Ezekiel 17.22-24 • Mark 4.26-34

A new perspective

Notes on the Bible readings

- It was common practice for preachers to carry letters affirming that they were genuine teachers of the gospel. Paul does not do this he simply has confidence that he follows God by faith, even when he can't see a way forward. While he is on earth and 'at home in the body' (v.6), Paul feels far from God, but as he approaches death, he knows he will soon be united with God and 'at home with the Lord' (v.8).
- Paul calls on his listeners not to value people according to the claims they make, for only Christ's judgement matters (v.10). The true test of a Christian is a change of heart, from human priorities to God's priorities, and this should be evident in the way they live.
- The idea of a new birth and a new identity is important in the Christian faith and highlights forgiveness. Paul goes even further and sees his life following Jesus Christ as a completely 'new creation' (v.17). He describes it as no longer living for himself, having died to his old way of life, but living for Jesus who was raised from the dead.
- Paul says the change is so momentous that all sense of human judgement of 'us' and 'them' disappears. Christians no longer define themselves in relation to others, but are called to participate in God's plan of love for the world. The multicultural port of Corinth, on an important trade route between Asia and Rome, was a good place to hear this message.
