Data Protection (GDPR)

A new regulation on data protection came into effect this year which, as with all churches, we have to comply with. This means that all personal data must be kept up to date, stored securely, destroyed appropriately and consent must be obtained. The PCC is the data controller and has approved a data privacy notice and consent form. You can read the notice on the Church website, on the Church notice board in the porch or Church Hall or you can request a copy from one of the wardens.

Please return completed consent forms in the box at the back of Church. The completed forms will be stored in a locked filing cabinet in the vestry.

Parish Giving Scheme

Many people who come to church plan their giving to God within their normal household budget and, at the moment, there are a number of different ways this happens. Some people have standing orders with their bank, others give through the yellow envelopes, brown envelopes or one-off gifts. And you will know that gift-aided donations enable the church to reclaim tax on that money which adds 25% to the value of your gift. A sincere thank you to all of you who give faithfully however you choose to do so. We are truly blessed by your generosity.

The Parish Giving Scheme is a Diocesan initiative, which our church has signed up to because it offers a number of benefits including making planned giving more user-friendly, maximizing our cash-flow and minimising our administration. If this scheme was to become the principal funding method for our Church, our giving could also be inflation-proofed, freeing us up to focus on other important priorities.
